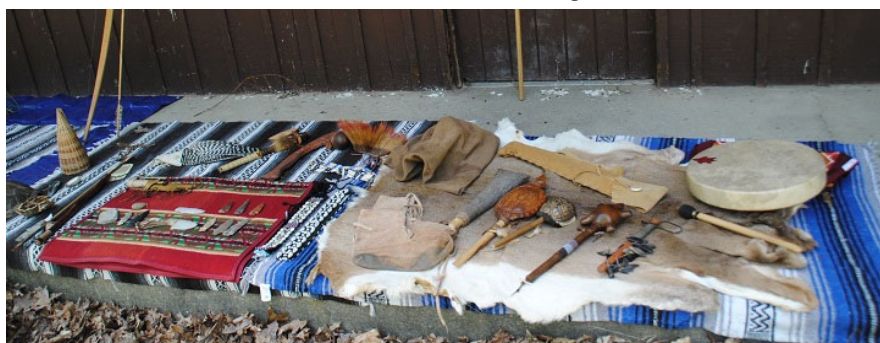

### A bit of history about the Daily Drench

The May weekend of the first SCOPE-Olympia started out beautiful on Thursday evening. Six motor coaches stopped at the church where our troop ??? Troop 2 met. The boys were eventually picked up by their host families. In the early days of Scope the "boys" went to school with their counterpart hosts. There are no records of how much was actually learned that day. In the evening everyone assembled at Militia Hill State Park. About 10:00 or 11:00pm the rain started, and didn't stop. We had a major 2" to 3" rainfall by about 5:00 in the morning. A lot of the sites were seriously under water. Sleeping bags had to be wrung out to even pick them up. Parents were called and from 7:00am to 1:00pm, the youth were picked up by their host families. The camp newspaper, at that point, had no name. It was completed by about 6:00am with the header "The Daily Drench". That was ~~36~~ years ago and the name stuck. It seemed to fit. 56

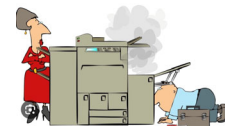


### Educating about Lenape Traditions

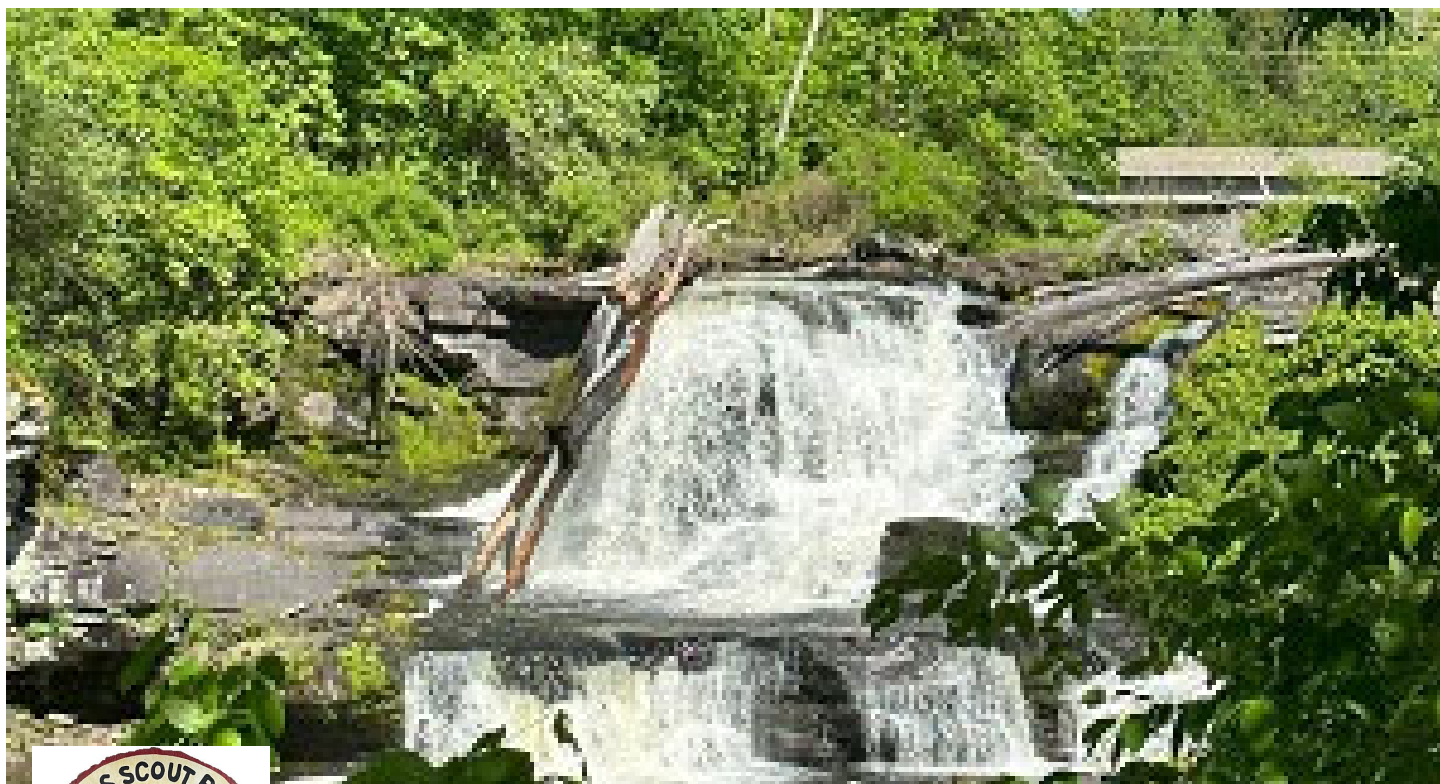


### Editors note

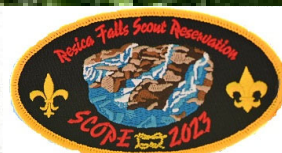
